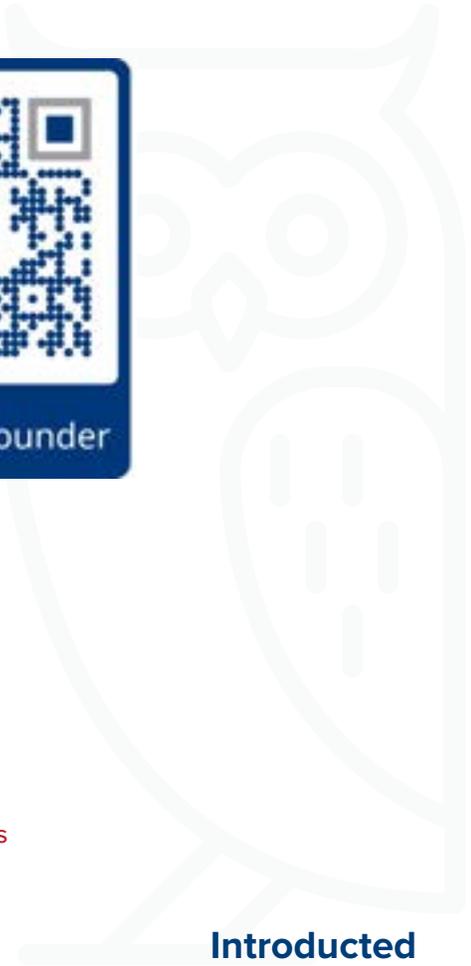

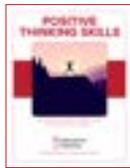

# What is Cognitive-Behavioral Content?

At Education Lifeskills, we acknowledge that behaviors are rooted in the values, attitudes, and beliefs of an individual, forming the foundation of their subconscious programming. This programming begins from birth and is influenced by family, community, society, and personal experiences. Often, individuals are not consciously aware of their own subconscious programming, as it becomes an integral part of their identity; it is “just who they are.” Our strategy for facilitating change involves initially addressing negative beliefs and mindset (cognitive) in order to tackle negative behavior (behavioral), hence our use of the term “Cognitive-Behavioral.”

Our courses are designed to challenge self-defeating thoughts and behaviors, using vicarious stories, “You” statements, and introspective questions to foster new ways of thinking. Through the content and learning activities, students become aware of their own values, attitudes, and beliefs. The following are excerpts from some of our most utilized courses.

## Subconscious Programming

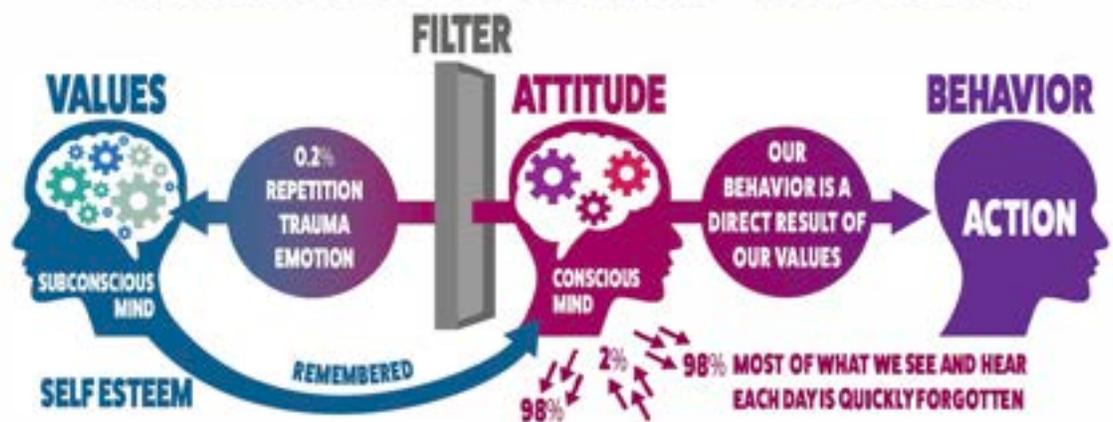


To understand who we are is to understand our subconscious mind.

The subconscious mind is like a blank canvas at birth. It is soon filled with negative and positive experiences. Repeated experiences program our subconscious. In turn, our subconscious largely determines our values, attitudes, and beliefs, resulting in our behaviors.

The subconscious mind does not know right from wrong; it only knows what has been programmed into it. If we want to improve ourselves, we need to understand our subconscious mind and how it is programmed.

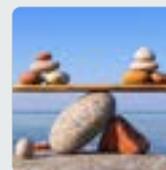

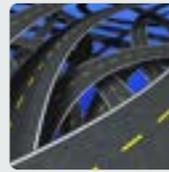

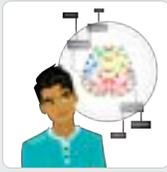

# Restorative Practices

## Professional Development for Educators

As part of our comprehensive approach to discipline in education, we offer Restorative Practices Professional Development workshops for staff. Like so many educators, we recognize the limitations of punitive discipline, and its potential to exacerbate rather than alleviate negative behavior. A restorative approach to discipline focuses on repairing harm, rebuilding relationships, and restoring trust between the individual and their (school) community. Our workshops are designed to give educators a comprehensive understanding of Restorative Practices, implementation strategies, and helpful skills and tools to increase intervention capacity.



### Rooted in Restorative Practice

This workshop will describe the relational model and mindset that needs to be built and the philosophical underpinnings that accompany a successful Restorative Practice Framework. Rationale for a school-wide implementation will be discussed along with the interpersonal skills that need to be cultivated in each educator. Each participant will leave with skill-based tools to grow their emotional capacity and positive influence with students and peers.



### Growing Restorative Culture

This workshop focuses on growing the Restorative culture of the campus at large. Participants will come away with a deeper understanding of cultural responsiveness, implicit bias, growth mindset, and emotional hierarchy of needs. Educators will discuss how to educate the whole child, how to engage families, and how to employ effective prevention and intervention strategies that actually work.



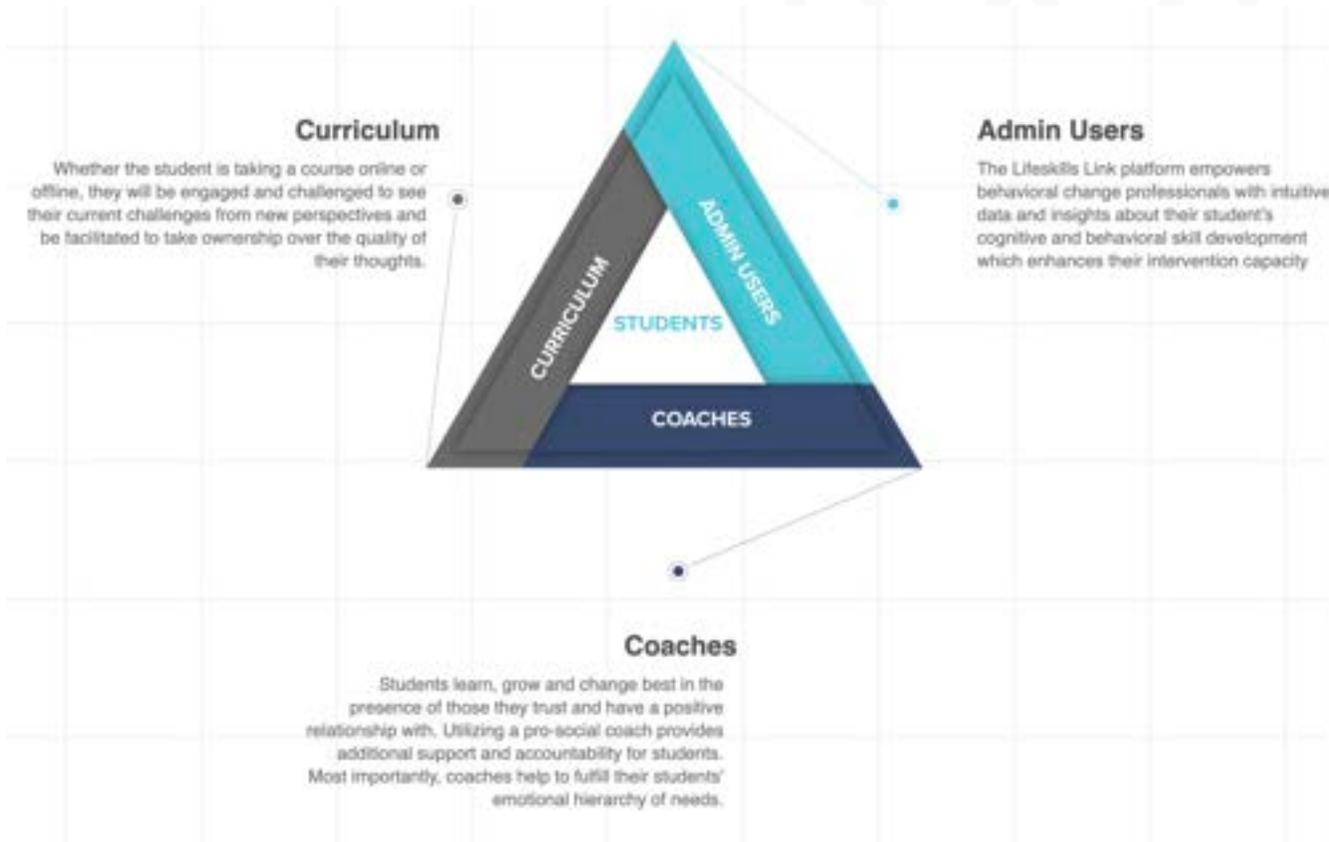
### Sustaining Restorative Capacity

This workshop guides educators through skills to address burnout and increase restorative capacity, allowing educators to cultivate deeper compassion for themselves. Participants will be given psychoeducation on the impact of trauma on the brain and nervous system, how to track your inner experience in the classroom and campus, and how to skillfully guide yourself to your resiliency zone.

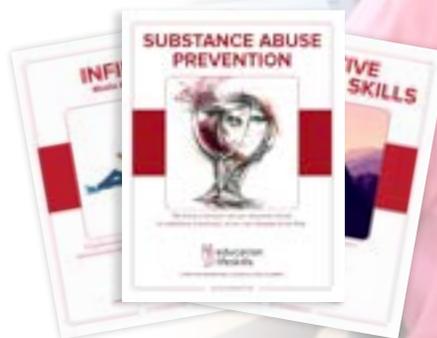

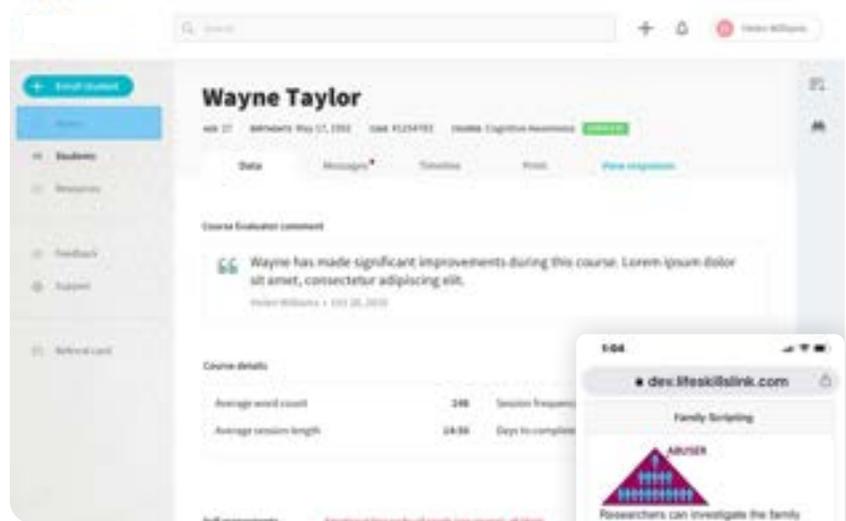

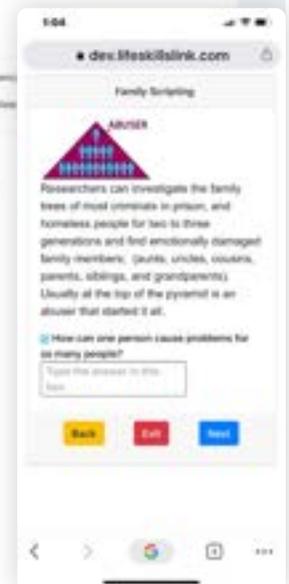
